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## Анотація

Збірник «Successful English» допоможе учням старших класів підготуватися до іспиту та державної підсумкової атестації з англійської мови.

Посібник складається 3 двох частин: Reading (читання) i Use of English (перевірка мовної компетенції) .

Особливістю посібника є наявність відповідей до завдань.
Матеріали підібрані з автентичних джерел та англомовних інтернет - сайтів, які сприяють розширенню кругозору.

У першій частині наведено п’ять основних завдань: питання, на які необхідно дати відповіді (Short answer questions), добирання заголовків і питань до тексту (Matching headings and questions to text), вибір речень або коротких абзаців для заповнення пропусків у тексті (Matching clauses to gaps in text), вибір частин речень для заповнення пропусків у тексті (Matching sentences to gaps in text), розміщення частин тексту в правильному порядку (Putting parts of a text in the correct order).

У другій частині збірника розміщені завдання, що спрямовані на перевірку мовної компетенції учнів дев'ятих класів, рівня сформованості їх рецептивних та репродуктивних лексичних і граматичних навичок: заповнення пропусків з необмеженою кількістю слів (Open gap filing), заповнення пропусків з обмеженою кількістю слів (banked gap filing), множинний вибір (multiple choice), словотворення (word formation), лексичні трансформації (word of transformation).

## Why Do People Become Vegetarians?

Anyone who has visited a grocery store or restaurant has probably seen food items labeled "vegetarian. These foods do not contain meat, and people who choose this type of diet are called vegetarians. Many different people of all ages are vegetarians and everyone has his or her own reasons for refusing to eat meat. Some believe eating meat is not good for you, some believe it is wrong to kill animals and some believe meat is too expensive.

Some people do not eat meat because they believe it is unhealthy. Certain types of meat contain a high amount of fat. Too much fat in your diet can cause health problems like heart attacks and cancer. People can also get serious diseases or infections from eating meat that is not cooked long enough. Not everyone who eats meat will have these problems, but many people stop eating meat because they do not want to take the chance.

Some people do not eat meat because they believe it is cruel to kill animals. This may be because their religion forbids it or because they do not like to think that an animal had to suffer and die just so they could have a meal. Many people who are vegetarians for this reason also avoid wearing clothes and shoes that are made of animal fur and leather.

Some people do not eat meat because they believe it is too expensive. By not buying meat, these vegetarians have more money left over to buy other kinds of food. Meat is high in protein, which is an important element of food that people need to stay alive. Vegetarians make sure they get the protein their bodies need by
 eating other, less expensive types of food like nuts, cheese and milk.

When people decide to stop eating meat, they must find alternative
